I enclose a copy of the bill - it ended up costing \$560. Thank you very much for helping us out so generously.

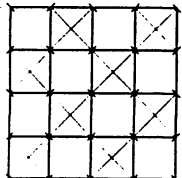
The exhibit seems to attract and hold the attention of our visitors. We continue to add extra pieces to the gallery that did not make it for the opening.

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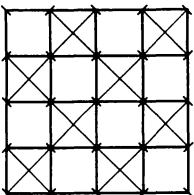

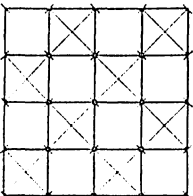
